Lay persons face the difficult task of interpreting the richness of the church's faith in a complex and confusing world. They need a theological education that supports their faith and also teaches them to express that faith in day-to-day events. As the emphasis on lay ministry

has grown, Education for Ministry (EFM) has come to play an important role by providing a program that develops an informed and knowledgeable laity.

EFM is a four year program that on the surface is a study and discussion of the Old and New Testaments, church history and theology - but under that is a loving, caring group that learns, grows and finds their ministry together. By examining their own beliefs and their relationship to our culture and the tradition of our Christian faith, participants can learn what it means to be effective ministers in the world.

The cathedral has two ongoing groups, one led by Jay Wright and another by Joe and Laura O'Shields. The groups are seeking new members and the studies will start in September. Please contact Laura and Joe O'Shields for more information at joeoshie@comcast.net.

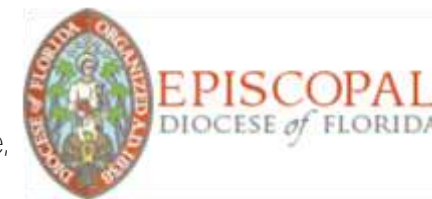

Bishop's Institute offers "A Weekend with C.S. Lewis"

The Bishop's Institute for Ministry and Leadership has been created by Bishop Howard and the Diocesan Foundation primarily as an educational resource for all priests, deacons and lay leaders in the Diocese, providing such leaders training and opportunities for deeper theological growth through retreats, speaker events and forums. The Institute is proud to offer "A Weekend with C.S. Lewis - C.S. Lewis Caught Off Guard" as its first event. Any clergy or lay people of the Diocese are welcome to attend.



The weekend will be led by renowned C.S. Lewis scholar, Reverend Earl Palmer, and will be held at the Cerveny Conference Center at Camp Weed on September 18-20. Lecture topics during the weekend include C.S. Lewis' journey of faith, his time in World War I, his work as an apologist, and his talent as a master storyteller. The weekend will close with Eucharist on Sunday morning, followed by lunch.

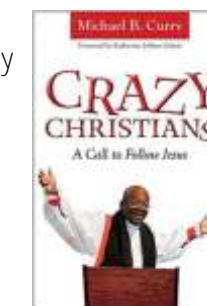

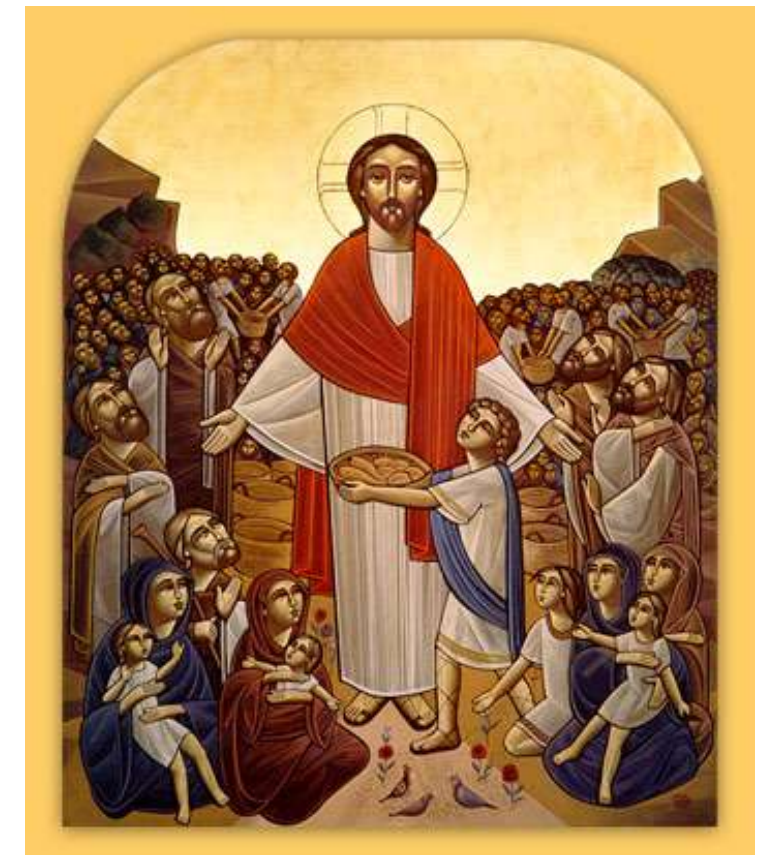
