Lay persons face the difficult task of interpreting the richness of the church's faith in a complex and confusing world. They need a theological education that supports their faith and also teaches them to express that faith in day-to-day events. As the emphasis on lay ministry

has grown, Education for Ministry (EFM) has come to play an important role by providing a program that develops an informed and knowledgeable laity.

EFM is a four year program that on the surface is a study and discussion of the Old and New Testaments, church history and theology - but under that is a loving, caring group that learns, grows and finds their ministry together. By examining their own beliefs and their relationship to our culture and the tradition of our Christian faith, participants can learn what it means to be effective ministers in the world.

The cathedral has two ongoing groups, one led by Jay Wright and another by Joe and Laura O'Shields. The groups are seeking new members and the studies will start in September. Please contact Laura and Joe O'Shields for more information at joeoshie@comcast.net.

Springfield art exhibit in Taliaferro Hall

We invite you to take some time this month to view our latest art exhibit in Taliaferro Hall, featuring the work of parishioner Jesse "Jay" Wright. The exhibit is inspired by the Springfield neighborhood, an area the artist sees as an "epicenter" exemplifying our ever-changing world. In its scenes of urban decay and temporal beauty, "new wonders...continue to appear, if only one has eyes to see."



The exhibit is also inspired by abstract expressionist art, and several works are created with "found objects," which reveal how "the real world and the world of art interchange. Accidental beauty is everywhere, and despite the sadness of the deteriorating reality all around us, there is a real joyful aspect to this work" in the hope of renewal.

Volunteer for Family Promise

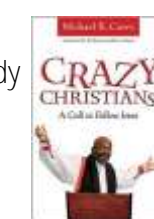
