If you would like to provide Coffee Hour treats after Sunday services, please sign up on the easel in Taliaferro Hall. This is a great activity for groups to do too!

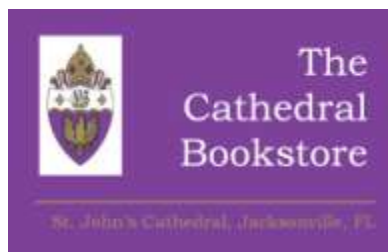
Visioning Forum on Sunday, September 27

Parish Nurse Ministry: A New Approach

The purpose of this ministry is to touch the whole congregation with information, knowledge and skills that will help raise awareness of the relationship between health and spiritual well-being, and to encourage each member of the congregation to understand that health is a gift and each person is responsible for their own health and their lifestyle choices.

Over the past 10+ years the Parish Nurses have endeavored to meet these standards. The component of the Parish Nurse ministry involving taking blood pressure readings on certain Sundays started off with a big bang, but has recently seen a dramatic decline in participation. Due to this decline, we will no longer be taking blood pressures following the Sunday services. However, if you need your blood pressure checked, please see Nina Searcy or Sheila or Tom Burrell after the 11 a.m. service and we will be glad to take your blood pressure.
