### The woman and the old sacristy

Dear Friends,

Last weekend, I traveled to the Diocese of the Central Gulf Coast to run a retreat for the women of the diocese. These women were extraordinary. We talked about Mary Magdalene and her role as someone who suffered from demons yet became one of the greatest followers of Jesus. Some of these women were Daughters of the King and many had served in their churches for years. There were some incredible stories told. I want to share one of them with you.

Some time ago, after fifty years of marriage, one woman came home to find that her husband was leaving her for a younger woman. She was so distraught that she went to bed and stayed there for some time. Her sisters convinced her to come to the diocesan women's retreat that year. She came, but immediately got back into bed once she arrived.

One of her sisters scolded her and told her to get up, that God had work for her to do. So she got up and started walking around the camp and conference center. She wandered into an old sacristy that was messy, dirty and covered in cobwebs. She said to herself, "This room looks like how I feel," and she began cleaning.

As she cleaned that sacristy, God came to her, and it became clear that she was to work in her church. It was her way forward, her path through her pain. This past summer, at the General Convention of the Episcopal Church, she was recognized as a Woman of Distinction for all the work that she had done in her community of faith since cleaning that old sacristy.

What makes us who we are? It is not only the crises that we must endure, but it is how we choose to respond to them.

### First Coast Wind Symphony Fall Concert, Sunday, October 18

St. John's Cathedral will present the First Coast Wind Symphony in concert on Sunday, October 18 at 5 p.m. The concert is free and the public is invited. The program, titled "Wind Pipes," will feature music for organ and winds. The program



includes works for organ and wind symphony, including André Campra's *Rigaudon* and Alfred Reed's celebratory *Alleluia! Laudamus Te*. Tim Tuller will also perform two solo works for organ by Elgar and Guilmant. The First Coast Wind Symphony, a 60-member community music organization led by music director Artie Clifton and conductor Paul Weikle, is in its 26th season. The group provides a cultural service to the Jacksonville community by offering free concerts of quality wind music. A reception will follow the concert.
