Youth group "lost in a-maze-ment" over life-sized maze

"I just made a right," I think to myself. "Should I go right again, or is that even a real path in front of me?"

Have you ever had the experience of being lost in a maze made of corn (or something like it) in the dark? That's how St. John's Cathedral youth spent the evening of Saturday, October 17. We met up at the cathedral, piled into four cars, and made our way to Elkton, Florida, the home of Sykes and Cooper Farms and their amazing "corn" maze. Fifteen youth and five adults enjoyed food, fun, and fellowship right in our own back yard.

Sykes and Cooper Farms' corn maze is actually cut into sorghum. According to the event website (www.sycofarms.com) sorghum is "a crop used primarily for cattle feed. Sorghum looks similar to corn but does not actually have corn cobs on it. The reason sorghum is used instead of corn is because it is stronger and more tolerant to Florida's unpredictable weather." Honestly, we couldn't tell the difference!



In addition to the maze there was traditional fair food, like funnel cakes (yum!), games for kids like duck races and a (fake) cow milking contest, and chickens, goats, pigs, and one very noisy donkey. The night ended with a communal hay ride pulled by a John Deere tractor. We even ran into some of our fellow St. John's parishioners there in Elkton! It was a fun and enjoyable evening with friends and family, the weather was beautiful...and the corn was tall. So much fun was had by youth and adults that I think we'll put this on the calendar for next year as well. A special thanks to Devanne Jones for the idea and coordinating the trip, and to Jim and Martha Cox and Megan Cochran who helped chaperone.

CALL FOR VESTRY NOMINATIONS AND CONVENTION DELEGATES

The Vestry bylaws provide for a nominating committee to nominate candidates for vacancies on the vestry as well as candidates for the offices of Delegate to the Diocesan Convention.

Qualifications for Vestry members (5 to be elected): A Vestry nominee must be a **communicant of St. John's Cathedral in good standing for a period of at least 12 months** prior to election; if a nominee has served two full terms (for a total of six years), there must be a two-year break before he or she may be nominated again; must be actively involved in the ministry of the Parish; must be willing to accept active leadership, including responsibility for decision making that represents the entire Parish; must, if called upon, serve on the boards of affiliated corporations of the Cathedral; must be willing to invest the time necessary in the ministry of leadership, including attendance at worship, Vestry meetings and other scheduled Vestry activities, special events, and satellite activities; and must be otherwise eligible. In addition to the above qualifications contained in the bylaws, the Vestry believes that nominees for service for the next three-year term should possess special skills, gifts and talents in visionary and strategic thinking, be courageous, and have skills in fiscal planning and policy.

Diocesan Convention Delegates (2 to be elected): **Per the St. John's Parish** by-laws, the Sr. Warden fills one of the 5 delegate positions. The remaining four convention delegates serve a two year term, with one or two rotating off each year. At the 2016 Annual Parish Meeting, we will elect two delegates and two alternates for the 2017 diocesan convention. It is critically important that you obtain the permission of your nominee before submitting his or her name to a Nominating Committee member. (Please note: the By-Laws have been amended so that parishioners choose Vestry members by election at the annual meeting rather than through a selection (lottery) process.) Nominations will be forwarded to and reviewed by the nominating committee members: Bill Erwin, Lynda Erwin, Faye Wisner, Ryan Uitti, Robert Hyde, Jim Jamison, Bonnie Hardman and Hud Berrey.
