

Urban Land Institute to visit the cathedral

Dear People of God,
 Something exciting is going on at the cathedral this week. The Urban Land Institute will be holding a Technical Assistance Panel, or TAP, here at the cathedral on January 12 and 13. This means that a panel of experts in urban development from all over the nation will gather to assess our cathedral district and give us feedback on how we can revitalize our neighborhood.




This event was coordinated by vestry member Ginny Myrick and her Campus Council. Participants include representatives from the Diocese of Florida, Aging True (the non-profit that we birthed that owns the three large residential towers in our neighborhood), CathedralCare (formerly known as the Gerontology Center), Immaculate Conception Church, The First United Methodist Church, The Cathedral Condos Association, The Cathedral School, and Community Connections (the homeless shelter for women and children next door to us).

For years, I have dreamed with you of a village surrounding the cathedral, where people could walk to the grocery store or visit in a park or garden, where the doors of the cathedral would be open for people to eat at Clara's on Fridays or to shop at our bookstore. We have envisioned a village that focused on the beautiful architectural jewel that is our church, a place where young people would want to live and work. What we are talking about here is building community and creating a sense of space here in the urban core. This, my friends, is "Love at the Core."

Please pray on January 12 and 13, this Tuesday and Wednesday, for this magnificent opportunity. I cannot wait to share the results with you.
