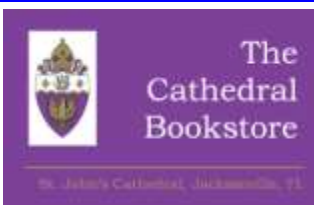
### Save the date for the Annual Parish Meeting!
