Save the date for the Annual Parish Meeting!

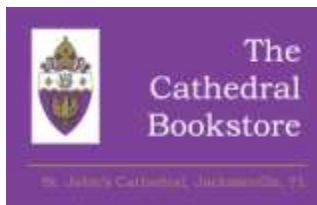

Prepare for the Annual Meeting: meet our nominees

Dear Friends,

Today you have the opportunity to meet and get to know the candidates running for Vestry and Diocesan Convention delegates during coffee hour after the 11 a.m. service. I hope that many of you will try to come.

What is the Vestry? The Vestry is the governing body of our cathedral. They work with me to oversee the finances and general health of the parish. It is vital that we have strong leaders elected to the Vestry, people who can understand administrative issues, work with disagreement and devote time in ministry. Parishioners have sometimes elected people to the Vestry as a reward for long-time committed membership, but election to the Vestry is not a merit-badge, nor is it a popularity contest. I want you to truly consider and pray about who would be best to serve in this role. Certain gifts are needed to serve on a governing board. Not all people are called to this ministry, but that does not mean that they are not loved and valued by us.

We will also be electing representatives to Diocesan Convention. These people will represent our cathedral at the annual gathering of the Diocese of Florida. They will vote on issues affecting the diocese and meet and greet faithful members of other parishes. Please pray about who you would like to represent our cathedral on the diocesan level.

Running for Vestry or diocesan representative is an act of faithfulness. Each one of these candidates has been carefully selected by the Nominating Committee, and each person should be thanked for their devotion. All of these nominees has already shown that they are devoted and effective in serving Christ, as they are already leaders here regardless of the election results. It is an honor to be nominated in such a large church.

Please take the time to familiarize yourself with this slate of nominees. Information on our nominees can be accessed on our website, jaxcathedral.org. Elections will take place at the Annual Meeting on Sunday, January 31 after the 11 a.m. service. Lunch will be served and the nursery will be open.
