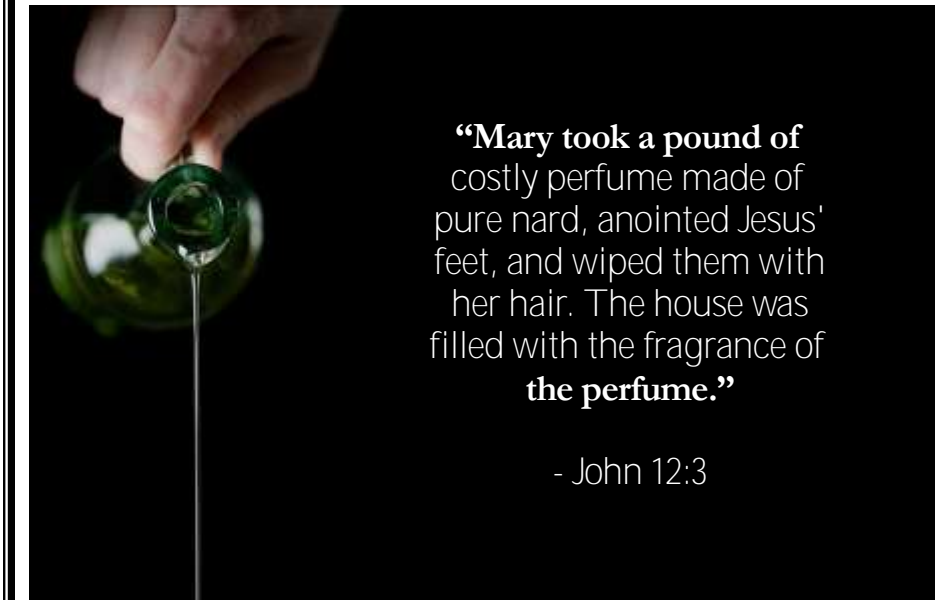

Last week, a Jacksonville police officer was shot while taking his fourteen-year-old son to school. The officer is alive and expected to recover, though he is currently in the hospital with a gunshot wound to the head. My heart breaks for the teenager who witnessed the shooting of his father.

According to The Florida Times-Union, in 2015 there were 113 homicides in Jacksonville. 82 of these deaths were caused by guns. Shootings seem almost commonplace in our local news, but we are not the only city to endure such violence. What must we do to stop the violence? How can we help? Our country is divided when it comes to deciding how to address recurring and systemic violence. No matter what your opinions are on the steps that we need to take, we must all begin with prayer.

I believe in the power of prayer. I believe in the mysterious relationship that we forge with God when we pray and how that relationship can transform our lives. What would happen if every member of our congregation took a vow to pray daily for peace on the streets of Jacksonville and for peace throughout the world?

St. Paul talks about putting on the armor of Christ. Let us put on that armor and pray for guidance.
