Fruit of the Spirit, Cummings Chapel

All are invited to participate in a civil discourse forum on health care on Monday, April 11 from 5:30 - 8 p.m. in Taliaferro Hall. The evening will begin with a light dinner after which groups will gather in different rooms for dialogue. Everyone will be asked to complete a post-forum questionnaire. The first in this series of cathedral civil discourse events was held last month with 40 people attending. Two deliberative groups addressed the wealth gap in the United States and how to provide for economic opportunity for all Americans. Participants also chose subject preferences for future forums.
