

Thank you for your kind words, hugs, cards and gifts as I begin this sabbatical. Please pray for me, for the inspiration to write and to rest with family. Let me tell you a few pieces of good news and information to know while I am gone.

As most of you know, I will be gone from May 1 - August 1. I will be completely unplugging. What that means is that I will not be checking email, Facebook or any other social media. Fr. David Erickson and our clergy assistant Tina Hutcherson can reach me in case of an emergency.

Fr. Carl and Laura Saxton will be staying with us until I return. As you know, Fr. Carl is a curate, which means he has been training and learning with us these first two years of his priesthood.
