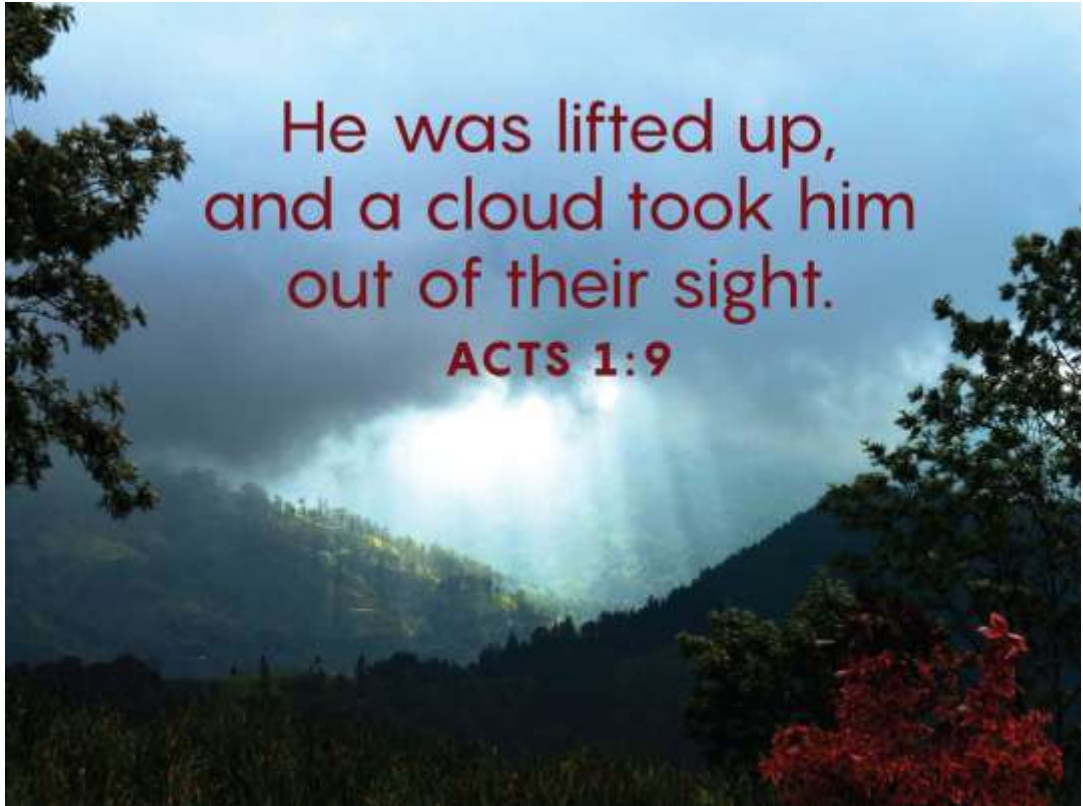

St. John's Cathedral has always stood on this very spot, Billy Goat Hill, the highest geographical point in Jacksonville. When the population began moving out of the downtown area in the 1960's, this congregation felt strongly that God was calling us to stay here in the heart of the city. Since that time, the Cathedral has birthed all kinds of ministries, caring for the homeless, for children and the elderly, and working to promote the arts, education and healthcare. We are now striving to create a vibrant neighborhood around Billy Goat Hill, a place where diverse peoples of many income levels can live and grow together. We believe that by worshipping and serving God in the urban core, we can catch a glimpse of God's love.

We welcome all people. Our nursery is open all morning on Sundays. We would love to get to know you better, and you can help us by filling out a visitor card located in your pew and placing it in the offering plate as it comes by, or by handing it to an usher. Please let us know if you need prayers and if you would like us to email you our online newsletter. Listening devices are always available for the hearing impaired and large-print bulletins for those who have trouble with their eyesight. Please ask an usher if you need these items or anything else. We want to help you feel at home here.

We believe that worship should be beautiful and sacred, a moment to hush the hurriedness of our lives and experience the peace of God. I hope that you feel God's love this morning.

OUTREACH AT ST. JOHN'S CATHEDRAL

St. John's Cathedral has a long and joyful history of outreach in Jacksonville. At the present moment, our outreach ministries are carrying on a tradition of engaging hands and hearts in downtown Jacksonville.

You can deepen **your connection with St. John's and join our community of saints** serving each other.

Some of our outreach involves sharing our beautiful Taliaferro Hall - a kind of "in-reach." Our fellowship hall has a grace and elegance that lifts special events. Olivia's Tea, an event that teaches etiquette, manners, and character to low-income children in Jacksonville, takes place in Taliaferro; hundreds of hospitality trainees have also learned their craft each Friday as they serve lunch during Clara's at the Cathedral. In addition, families live for a week at the Cathedral through Family Promise. We support these temporarily homeless families three times a year, by making dinner, packing lunches, and spending the night with them at the Cathedral.

Many ministries take us outside the Cathedral. Each week, Church Without Walls serves sandwiches after a worship service in a nearby parking lot; we serve dinner to people who are homeless at the Sulzbacher Center, and provide a constant supply of clothes for families and children at the Downtown Ecumenical Services Council, Inc.

This work is crucial to the well-being and health of our city. A recent job fair held in Taliaferro Hall, operated by FlourishNow, served more than 250 job seekers, 14 of whom got a job on the spot. The job fair served people who live around the Cathedral, 20 percent of whom live on public assistance right now. As one FlourishNow partner said, the event was a game-changer for the Cathedral District.

One of Jacksonville's strongest nonprofits got its start at St. John's. For nearly 25 years, the Cathedral Arts Project (CAP), has worked to ensure all local students have access to arts education and creative experiences. CAP is now partly funded through the National Endowment for the Arts, one of 15 partners supporting the Any Given Child movement. One way you can help is for a group of parishioners or a family to adopt a class this coming school year, so that underserved students can fully appreciate their God-given creativity.

Because of our history of impact and success, we have a constant stream of requests from agencies located in Jacksonville, and even from other countries - the needs and opportunities are always there. Your possibilities for giving back are many! The Outreach Council wants to help you define how you and your family will give back this coming year. Your talents and your time are precious resources which the Outreach Council wants to celebrate and see flourish.

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, “Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.” Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away. When they had entered the city, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying, Peter, and John, and

The Celebrant and People say

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We beseech you to bring peace to our broken world. Protect the innocent, guide our government and bring harmony among races and peoples.

We pray for all who are lonely, suffering, ill or grieving. Comfort them, and reveal to them the healing power of your Holy Spirit.

Risen Christ, *Comfort us.*

Stand with us, Risen Christ, and help us to become a people of resurrection hope, radical hospitality and radiant love in the core of Jacksonville.

All baptized people are welcome to receive communion. Everyone is welcome to come to the altar for a blessing. If you would like a blessing, please fold your arms across your chest. You are also invited to receive prayers and anointing with holy oil in one of our transept chapels (Ascension to the south, and Holy Communion to the north) where anointers wait to pray with you.
