The Lesson Acts 2:1-11

*Lector* A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs-- in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power."

## HOLY BAPTISM

### Presentation and Examination of the Candidates

*The candidates are presented by their Sponsors*

*Celebrant* The Candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.  
*Sponsors* I present William Tiexiera Taweh Bruce, Erasmus SeonMin Connally, Oscar Elbert Connally, Breck Joseph Ervin, Gabriella Kristin Holliman, Robert Glenn Plume and Chanda Baer Marie Rauhauser to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

*When all have been presented the Celebrant asks the Sponsors of the children*

Will you be responsible for seeing that the children you present are brought up in the Christian faith and life?

*Parents and Sponsors* I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant* Will you by your prayers and witness help these children to grow into the full stature of Christ?

*Parents and Sponsors* I will, with God's help.

*The Celebrant asks the adult candidate*

*Celebrant* Do you desire to be baptized?

*Candidates* I do.

*Then the Celebrant asks the adult candidate and Sponsors*

*Question* Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

*Answer* I do.

*Question* Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

*Answer* I do.

*After the candidates have been presented, the people stand and the Celebrant addresses the congregation, saying*

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

*People* We will.

*Celebrant* Let us join with these persons who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

### The Baptismal Covenant

*Celebrant* Do you believe in God the Father?

*People* I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

*Celebrant* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

*People* I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

*Celebrant* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?  
*People* I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

*Celebrant* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?  
*People* I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant* Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?  
*People* I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant* Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?  
*People* I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?  
*People* I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?  
*People* I will, with God's help.

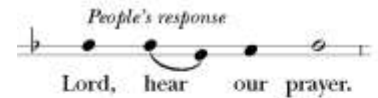
### Prayers for the Candidates

*The Celebrant then says to the People*

Let us now pray for these persons who are to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

*The candidates for Baptism, their Sponsors, and the Clergy process to the font.*

*Cantor* Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.  
*People* Lord, hear our prayer.



*Cantos* Open their hearts to your grace and truth.  
*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Cantor* Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit.  
*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Cantor* Keep them in the faith and communion of your holy Church.  
*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Cantor* Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit.  
*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Cantor* Send them into the world in witness to your love.  
*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Cantor* Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory.  
*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*The Celebrant says*

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever. *Amen.*

### Thanksgiving over the Water

*The Celebrant then says*

The Lord be with you.

*People* And also with you.

*Celebrant* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*People* It is right to give him thanks and praise.

*Celebrant* We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*At the following words, the Celebrant touches the water*

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. *Amen.*

## The Baptism

*The candidates are presented by name for Baptism and Chrismation, and are presented with a Baptismal candle, a sign of the Light of Christ within them.*

*Celebrant* I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*Then the Celebrant marks on their foreheads the sign of the cross and says*

*Celebrant* You are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. *Amen.*

*The Celebrant then says*

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. *Amen.*

*The Celebrant says*

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

*Celebrant and People*

We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

## The Peace

*The Celebrant says to the People*

The Peace of the Lord be always with you.

*People* And also with you.

*The Clergy and People greet one another in the name of the Lord.*

In Christ you shared our life that we might live in him and he in us.

*He opened wide his arms upon the cross and, with love stronger than death, he made the perfect sacrifice for sin.*

Lord Jesus Christ, our redeemer, on the night before you died you came to table with your friends. Taking bread, you gave thanks, broke it and gave it to them saying, Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

*Lord Jesus, we bless you: you are the bread of life.*

At the end of supper you took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said, Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins; do this in remembrance of me.

*Lord Jesus, we bless you: you are the true vine.*

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ:

*Dying, you destroyed our death, rising, you restored our life; Lord Jesus, come in glory.*

Holy Spirit, giver of life, come upon us now; may this bread and wine be to us the body and blood of our Savior Jesus Christ.

*As we eat and drink these holy gifts make us, who know our need of grace, one in Christ, our risen Lord.*

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, Blessed Trinity: with your whole Church throughout the world we offer you this sacrifice of thanks and praise and lift our voice to join the song of heaven, for ever praising you and singing:

## The Breaking of the Bread

*The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept.*

*Celebrant*           The bread which we break is a sharing in the body of Christ.  
*People*               *We being many are one body, for we all share in the one bread.*

*The Celebrant continues*

Draw near with faith. Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood which he shed for you. Remember that he died for you, and feed on him in your hearts by faith with thanksgiving.

### ***Please join us at God's table.***

*All baptized people are welcome to receive communion. Everyone is welcome to come to the altar for a blessing. If you would like a blessing, please fold your arms across your chest. You are also invited to receive prayers and anointing with holy oil in one of our transept chapels (Ascension to the south, and Holy Communion to the north) where anointers wait to pray with you.*

## A Message from the Dean

### About Pentecost

Dear Friends,

There are three major feast days in the life of the Church. The first is Christmas, the second is Easter, and the third but equally important feast day is called Pentecost. Pentecost is the day that the followers of Jesus became the Church. It is the day that the Holy Spirit arrived on the scene. Without the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, none of us would be Christians.

It is traditional for Christians to wear red on the Day of Pentecost. Red is the color of love, passion and fire. When the Holy Spirit first came to the disciples in the upper room, it came as wind, as fire and as language. The Holy Spirit came to communicate a message from God about Jesus, and thousands of people were inspired that day. Don't ever forget that Pentecost is as important as Easter and Christmas. Just because Hallmark and our commercialized, modern American culture have not gotten a hold of this holy day does not mean that it is not just as important as the other two holidays. The only reason Pentecost has not been coopted by our consumer frenzy is simply because the events of the day were so extraordinary that they could not be tamed. You can't turn the arrival of the Holy Spirit into Christmas trees and reindeer or Easter eggs and bunny rabbits.

The season of Pentecost is the perfect time to learn how to listen to the living presence of God in your life, for the Holy Spirit does speak and communicate with you daily just as that same Spirit spoke to the early followers of Jesus. All you have to do is listen carefully.

WHITSUNDAY (another name for the Day of Pentecost) is a name which we don't use as often as Pentecost. It is the 50th day after Easter and coincides with the Jewish festival Shavuot, which celebrates the first fruits of the harvest. Today we celebrate the birth of the Church. The origin of the name "Whitsunday" is uncertain, but it may have originally meant "White Sunday," as this was a traditional time of baptism and white is the color of the robes worn by the newly baptized.
