

A BRIEF HISTORY

For nearly 200 years, St. John's Cathedral has been in the forefront of spiritual leadership and community service in Jacksonville's urban core. Our first parish building stood on the corner of Church and Market Street, a spot known as Billy Goat Hill, the highest geographical point in Jacksonville, where the Cathedral stands today.

- 1829 | First Episcopal services in Jacksonville held on the bank of the St. Johns River
- 1834 | St. John's Parish incorporated by the act of the Territorial Council of Florida
- 1838 | Diocese of Florida organized
- 1851 | First church building dedicated
- 1863 | Union soldiers burn St. John's Parish

- 1901 | Great Fire of Jacksonville destroys the second church

- 1951 | St. John's becomes the Cathedral of the Diocese of Florida
- 1970 | Cummings Chapel constructed
- 1983 | Major restoration and renovation of St. John's Cathedral








- 1962 | Cathedral Foundation establishes Aging True
